What is reporting based on standards?

 A way to inform parents about their children's progress toward achieving specific learning standards. Students are measured on a standard instead of against other students.

Why is RP reporting based on standards?

- Links standards together throughout the grade levels
- So students will know what is expected in his or her learning
- Provides parents and student a clearer picture of what he/she knows and can do; also provides where and what to improve to meet proficiency

Which standards will my child be measured on?

- For each grade level, specific learning standards have been established. The standards determined for the grade level are called Power Standards.
- The smaller increments of skills, knowledge and understanding to reach the Power Standards are called Learning Targets.

(Power Standards and Learning Targets Provided)

Fundamental Principles We Follow within a Standards Referenced Reporting System

- Students learn in different ways
- Students learn in different time frames
- Mistakes are necessary and productive in learning
- Problem-Solving and critical thinking are integral
- Students must have ownership in their learning and data
- Students must know the purpose of their learning
- Students receive frequent and specific feedback
- Student scoring is based on knowledge of a learning goal, not attitude or effort.

Score 4

Learning and performing <u>beyond</u> grade-level or course standard criteria for proficiency

Score 3

 Meeting grade-level or course standard criteria for proficiency independently, thoroughly, and accurately

Score 2

 Progressing toward grade-level or course standard criteria for proficiency with some additional help and support

Score 1

Consistently requiring assistance to perform Level 2 criteria

Student Learning Attributes

Effort

Perseveres and attempts quality work

Engagement

Actively participates and listens; shows interest

Responsibility

Follows directions; meets deadlines; manages time; advocates for self

Respectful

Respects people and property

Prepared

Prepares and organizes for learning

Practices We Follow

- No Zeros
- No Extra Credit
- Homework is used for practice
- Homework may be differentiated for student readiness
- Late work is scored without academic penalty
- Opportunities for resolving incomplete work
- Multiple chances to demonstrate understanding

Practices We Follow (continued)

- Most recent scores and trends are used to determine understanding/mastery (no averaging, total points or weighting)
- Report non-academic standards separately
- Do not include group scores
- Do not consider behavior in score
- Organize and report by standards/learning targets.
- Involve students in the learning process of setting goals and monitoring learning
